The Parents/Carers - I/We shall endeavour to:

- See that my/our child attends school regularly, is on time in the morning and is collected on time after school, and is properly dressed and equipped (including having a PE and a swimming kit)
- Support my/our child in their daily reading, homework and other opportunities for home learning
- Attend Parents' Evenings, and discussions about my child's progress, including (when possible) curriculum

- Contact the school by 9.10am on the first day of sickness and every day thereafter, until they return to school
- Support the school's absence policy by minimizing the amount of time my child is absent from school except when too ill to attend
- Uphold the school policy for healthy lunches by ordering a free hot lunch from Reception to Year 2; and then, from Years 3 to 5 purchasing a school lunch or providing a balanced packed lunch with no sweets, chocolate bars or fizzy drinks

The School - The school will endeavour to:

- Encourage pupils to do their best at all times
- Contact parents if there are any significant concerns
- Send parents a termly electronic update on their child's progress through Classroom Monitor in Autumn and Spring terms (Yrs1-5) and through Build a Profile (Reception) at least half termly
- Send an annual written report in the Summer term
- Arrange Parents' Evenings twice a year
- Provide a monthly opportunity for parents to see their child's work in school
- Set, mark and monitor homework as per the homework policy
- Keep parents informed about school activities and what is being taught
- Provide regular information concerning school life, events and educational opportunities
- Work with the Friends (PTA) to provide wider opportunities, resources and experiences for our children
