This is my last newsletter for this term and this academic year. Thank you all once again for your continued support, it is appreciated by us all.



WORCESTERSHIRE LIBRARIES WILD WORLD HEROES READING CHALLENGE!

The summer reading challenge launches tomorrow, Saturday, 10th July; this is an annual event for children aged 4-11 designed to encourage and motivate them to keep reading over the summer holidays. The Reading Agency, teamed with the WWF (World Wildlife Fund), have created the nature-themed 'Wild World Heroes Summer Reading Challenge'. Children sign-up online and set their own reading goals via the website: <https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/>
Libraries provide free access to public computers and internet so everyone can take part. Once registered online, children can collect a 'Wild World Heroes Adventure Sheet' from a library, borrow books, complete challenge trail steps and collect stamps and stickers along the way. Children achieving their reading goal can download a certificate online and collect a reading wristband from the library.
